Summary: The Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation grant is one of the most prestigious grants available to emerging figurative artists, as well as one of the most substantial. It is one of the longest-standing, with an illustrious history of recipients spanning more than half a century. It is also unique in its scope, in that it is available to students and artists around the world.

To date, the Foundation has provided financial assistance to more than 1600 students and artists in 40 countries. Its grantees are renowned artists, both nationally and internationally, as well as highly respected art professors, teachers and mentors.

The Foundation is extremely proud of its grantees and of their accomplishments. First grants are in the amount of CAD \$15,000 each. Subsequent grants are in the amount of CAD \$18,000 each. Grants are made directly to the beneficiaries, not through other organizations. The Foundation reserves the right to award grants in other amounts and to disburse funds in whole or in part, as it deems advisable. Grantees may not receive more than three grants in their lifetime.

Grants are awarded based solely on the information contained in the Application Form and the supporting documentation and material submitted with it. The Foundation does not conduct personal interviews.

The decision of the foundation is final and is not subject to review or appeal.

Workplace safety lies deep in our hearts at Threads of Life. So a partnership with the Board of Canadian Registered Safety Professionals is a natural fit. The BCRSP sets certification standards for occupational health and safety professionals in Canada. As part of our partnership, BCRSP has generously offered to fund the Threads of Life Scholarship.

## ELIGIBILITY

Threads of Life Scholarships may be applied for by any Canadian resident who: will be a full or part-time student in a college or university program, or a trade school, during the 2025-2026 academic year, and

- who has been affected by a workplace tragedy: a workplace fatality, life-altering injury or occupational disease.
- Threads of Life employees, children or relatives of employees are not eligible for this scholarship award.
- Application
- All submissions must include a completed application form, a written response to the questions outlined on the application form, including an account of community involvement, a letter of confirmation or acceptance into a college, university or trade school program, and a copy of your most recent university/college/trade school transcript, or high school transcript if you have not yet completed one year of university/college/trade school program.

## Transportation Association of Canada

TAC Foundation is pleased to offer students the opportunity to apply for scholarships valuing between \$2500 and \$6000. The scholarships are intended to help support their post-secondary education in transportation-related studies.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents.
- Must be enrolled at a post-secondary institution (university or college) in an academic program related to, and hope to pursue a career in, the planning, design, construction, operations, maintenance and program management of road and highway infrastructure and urban transportation. This includes, but isn't limited to, civil and transportation engineering.

**Summary:** : **Schulich Leader Scholarships** are Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. One hundred are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Half are valued at \$120,000 for engineering scholarships and half are valued at \$100,000\* for science and math scholarships. Every high school in Canada can nominate one graduating student each year to apply for the scholarship.

## REQUIREMENTS

## Hilary M. Weston Scholarship

Value: \$7500

The Hilary M. Weston Scholarship commemorates the legacy of Ontario's 26th Lieutenant Governor and is awarded to two graduate-level social work students in the area of mental health. Successful applicants each receive a one-time award of \$7,500.

### ELIGIBILITY

- Must be in or plan to enroll in a full-time graduate social work program at a publicly funded Ontario university.
- Students with disabilities must take at least 40% of a full course load.
- Demonstrated commitment to mental health through community service or work.
- Academic excellence required.
- Must have lived in Ontario for at least 12 consecutive months before registration.

### REQUIREMENTS

- Provide personal details (name, email, phone).
- Describe qualifications for the award.
- Submit a resume, education history, and proposed studies.
- Send official transcripts directly from the institution with a submission number.
- Include an academic reference letter and a personal reference letter, both containing specific details. From someone who is familiar with your community service or paid work that demonstrates your interest in and commitment to mental health issues

## Ontario Learn and Stay Grant

The Ontario Learn and Stay Grant provides funding for students studying in priority postsecondary programs in underserved and growing communities in Northern, Southwestern and Eastern Ontario. This program:

- requires you to work in the region where you studied
- responds to labour market needs, including in health care
- helps underserved and growing communities get the workers they need for in-demand professions

The grant will cover the cost of:

- tuition
- compulsory fees
- books
- other direct educational costs (for example, supplies, equipment)

## ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this grant, you must:

- successfully apply to and enrol in **the first or second year** of an eligible program
- be an Ontario resident
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person
- commit to working in the same region where you studied after you graduate
- not be receiving funding from any of the following government programs:
  - The BEGIN Initiative: Bridging Educational Grant in Nursing
  - Better Jobs Ontario
  - Skills Development Fund

## REQUIREMENTS

- Be a Canadian citizen or have permanent resident status
- Have primary residence in Canada
- Be a member of a Desjardins caisse in Quebec or of the Desjardins Ontario Credit Union at the time you apply and at the time you receive your scholarship
